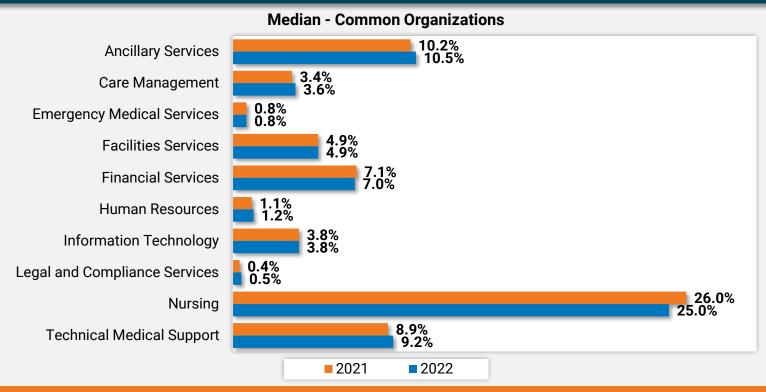
Workforce Size



As health care organizations look for better ways to optimize care delivery and improve performance, effectively managing the size, shape and complexity of the workforce remains a key initiative. Understanding workforce growth and distribution across different job families is also important and can play a key role in effective workforce planning.

Workforce Distribution by Job Family

The **relative size** of the health care workforce has remained stable from 2021 to 2022, with Ancillary Services, Nursing, and Technical Medical Support continuing to be the largest job families.

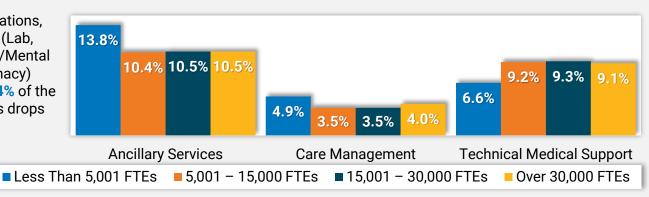


Relative Workforce Size by Job Family

Not every job family has the same relative size when you **compare sizes of organizations**. Here are three job families where there is variation in job family size as total organization size changes:

2022 Median Workforce Size as a Percent of the Total Workforce by Organization Size Category

In smaller organizations, Ancillary Services (Lab, Rehab, Behavioral/Mental Health, and Pharmacy) make up nearly 14% of the workforce, but this drops to 10.5% at larger organizations.

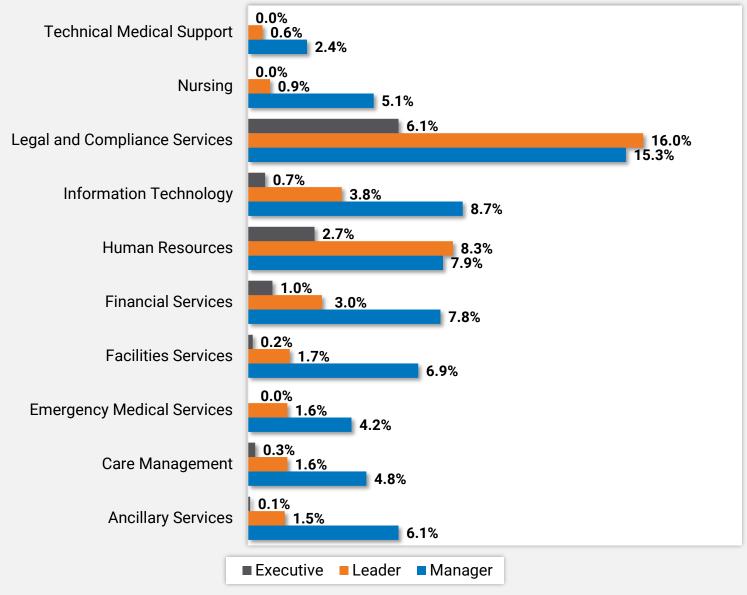




Management Workforce Size

Management roles generally make up about **10% or less** of the workforce for each job family. Notable exceptions are the Legal and Human Resources job families, with over 35% and nearly 20% of the workforce representing management roles, respectively.
