SullivanCotter recently partnered with a client to assess its professional services agreement (PSA) for anesthesia coverage – enabling the organization to stabilize coverage, improve financial performance, and enhance its service line strategy.



Private, not-for-profit health system in the Midwest with revenue of \$5B

Engaged to evaluate **terms and group performance** under PSA for anesthesiology coverage at **5 acute-care hospitals**



- Original PSA quickly became financially unsustainable due to rising subsidies.
- Client did not regularly measure performance relative to contract terms or the market.
- Anesthesia group frequently struggled to meet coverage demands forcing the health system to utilize more costly alternatives. It was also pressing for an increase in the financial subsidy within a short time frame in order to provide continued coverage.



- Conducted interviews with key stakeholders to understand both organization's goals, identify barriers to success, and improve overall performance.
- Performed comprehensive assessment of the PSA's financial and operational performance to help eliminate gaps in coverage.
- Identified underperforming third-party billings/collections provider.
- Focused on confirming that the subsidy paid to the group is appropriate and compliant.



- Stabilized Coverage: Renegotiated PSA terms to include clearer performance expectations and identified the optimal number of anesthesiologists to satisfy current and future coverage needs, patient volumes, and staffing models.
- Improved Financial Performance: Determined appropriate subsidy to support
 market-competitive and compliant compensation, agreed to conduct ongoing review
 of collections to validate subsidy and established new vendor to handle billing.
- Enhanced Service Line Strategy: Developed a sustainable anesthesia strategy to best meet organizational goals and growth related to surgical services.

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
